# Vietnam Paper Expo 2010

Looking into the paper industry scenario worldwide, there have been enormous developments in the Pulp, Paper and Packaging industry in the last two decades. Asia has an important role to play in this globally demanded industry. Keeping the Asian Paper industry scenario in mind we came up with an idea of creating a single platform for Paper, Pulp, Packaging, Converting and Printing Industry i.e. PapAsia. PapAsia is an international Endeavour to bring Paper and its allied industries like Pulp, Converting, Packaging and Printing, all together at a single platform. In it's second effort after organizing a successful event at India, next destination was chosen as Vietnam. Vietnam presently has about 300 paper mills which produce about 37% of domestic demand. Vietnam is all set to pour nearly 6 billion U.S. dollars into developing its paper and pulp industry till 2020 and to create new capacities. Present production of paper is about 1.13 million tons of paper of different kinds. So the event was a major breakthrough in the Paper and its allied industries at Vietnam. The event witnessed an international footfall and paved a way for Indian as well other international participants to explore the business opportunity at Royal Land of Vietnam. Few international companies who participated in the show were G-Impex SDN Bhd from Malaysia, Saurashtra Specialty Ltd. from India, Taiwan Hopex Chems Mfg. Co. Ltd. from Taiwan, R.I.K. Industries pte.ltd. from Singapore, Paramount Minerals and Chemicals, a China Pavilion comprises of 10 companies and many others.
